

Dear parishioners and friends of St Ignatius,

Earlier this year, before I joined the parish, an appeal was made to replace the lower windows in the Church. We were losing a lot of heat because of the single pane windows and due to the age of the windows. The goal was to raise approximately \$30,000 but we collected close to \$60,000. This generosity not only allowed us to replace all the lower windows in the Church with triple pane windows but also allowed us to undertake the repair of the plaster damage around the windows and to paint both sides of Church. As you see, this plaster and paint work is currently underway. Sorry for the inconvenience over the next few weeks but more importantly, thank you for your generosity! This work allows us to save money in the long run through lower heating bills and helps us to be good stewards in taking care of the parish and the environment.

This brings me to the Sharing God's Gifts (SGG) Annual Appeal. As you know, at St Ignatius we have decided to take up a second collection every other week throughout the year. This has worked extremely well, and parishioners have been very generous. The overall goal for the Archdiocese this year is \$1.2 million and the target set for our parish for 2024 is \$73,315. So far, we have raised \$52,127 which is about 71% of our parish goal. I am confident that by the end of the year we will not only achieve but exceed our goal.

The SGG Appeal allows our Archdiocese to fulfil our mission to "act justly, to love tenderly and walk humbly with our God."- Micah 6:8. If you have reviewed the brochure at the back of the Church you will know that the Appeal allows us in assisting various ministries including catechism, faith formation, prison ministry, chaplaincy, young adult ministry among many others. We should be proud that we are able to assist our brothers and sisters in need. As the Lord says, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' - Matthew 25:40. Our response to the SGG is one way to share our blessings with our neighbors and to express our gratitude for all the blessings that our most loving God has bestowed upon us.

We are using SGG to help our parish not only raise money for the Appeal but also to assist us in additional projects. Any money raised over and above our SGG target is returned to the parish and goes towards our own parish projects. Given that St Ignatius Church is an old building there are always repairs and renovations that need to be done to maintain our beautiful sacred space where so many come to worship, receive the sacraments and ultimately call home.

I am hoping to put the money that we raise over and above our SGG target towards at least 2 projects. Let me highlight these projects:-

!. Front Doors and Handicap Access: We have a beautiful ramp that many in our community use to access the front doors of the Church because they have walkers or wheelchairs or some other mobility devices that make climbing the front stairs difficult, if not impossible. Once they come up the ramp there is no access button which would allow them to open the doors and enter the Church. So, they must depend on the generosity of someone coming into the Church to hold the door open for them. This is fine so long as someone is arriving at the same time as they are but in the cold weather we hope they are able to push a button and allow themselves access to the Church when they arrive. Further, the doors currently do not meet the accessibility requirements on their own. Each door is only 31 inches wide, and the requirement is 38 inches. To deal with this I would like to install a handicap access button outside one of the doors which would allow 2

doors to open at the same time and this would take care of the space required for a wheelchair to enter.

Further, the doors at the front entrance of the Church are badly worn and need serious refurbishment and repair and I would like to work on all 3 sets of doors so that we have properly functioning doors for many years to coine.

The cost to repair the 3 sets of doors is approximately \$25,000 each which would bring the cost of the project to approximately \$80,000 including the access buttons mentioned above.

2. **West Stain Glass Window:** The stain glass window behind the altar is badly damaged on the outside due to regular exposure to the elements (sun, wind, rain and snow). Further, the window behind the stain glass is only single paned which means we are also losing heat. I would like to repair and fix this window so that we will be able to enjoy it for many years to come.

The cost to repair this window is approximately \$250,000. This will allow us to fix the frame on the outside and secure the window for the foreseeable future.

When I mentioned these projects, some parishioners had 2 important questions/concerns.

- 1. Will the increased amount raised effect our SGG goal for next year? In other words, will our target for next year go up if we raise over the \$73,315 current target. I conferred with the Archbishop and he assured me that the target would not be impacted since the target is based on a percentage of our annual offertory and not on how much we raise for SGG.
- 2. Will the excess money raised go toward paying off our current outstanding debt to the Archdiocese? Once again, I spoke to the Archbishop and he assured me that he would allow the excess money to be used toward the above-mentioned projects and would defer our repayment of the debt owed by the parish to the Archdiocese.

I know there are many obligations and concerns facing each of you and your families, but please consider supporting the SGG appeal and projects that I have highlighted above. I want to sincerely thank you for your generous support over the years and I look forward to working with you to secure this beautiful sacred space we call home. I encourage all of you to make a contribution towards this campaign. No amount is too small, and I would like 100% participation in this effort so that all of us can be proud of our beautiful parish.

Let us pray for the success of this year's SGG Appeal and I am confident that together, with everyone's participation, our parish will exceed our goal.
