Nicene Creed

This year marks the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea (in modern-day Turkiye). In the year 325, some 318 bishops gathered in Nicaea for an ecumenical council to discuss matters of great importance to the church. One of the greatest achievements was the definition of the faith in the form of a creed. Several years later, in 381, the Creed was endorsed by the 150 bishops



gathered in a new ecumenical council at Constantinople, notably with a few additions on the Holy Spirit. We know this Creed today as the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed.

Since the 1960's, in Canada, we have prayed the Apostles' Creed at Sunday Masses and Solemnities. The Apostles' Creed, whose present form is similar to the baptismal creed used in Rome in the second and third centuries, actually developed from questions addressed to those seeking baptism.

To highlight the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, the Council of Priests have recommended that the Nicene Creed be used, throughout the Archdiocese, in 2025. The Archbishop has encouraged us, throughout 2025, to pray the Nicene Creed at all Sunday Masses and Solemnities from the Solemnity of the Epiphany (January 5, 2025) to the Feast of the Holy Family, (December 28, 2025).

However, during the Lenten and Easter seasons the Apostles' Creed will be used. The Archbishop hopes that the use of the Nicene Creed, throughout 2025, will unveil for us the rich theological beauty of this ancient profession of faith.

Relics of St Jean de Brebeuf and St Kateri Tekakwitha at St Ignatius Church

Given the spiritual significance of the National Visitation of the Relics of St. Jean de Brebeuf and of St. Kateri Tekakwitha in this Jubilee Year 2025, Archbishop Gagnon has acceded to the request that St. Ignatius Church in Winnipeg be designated as an additional Jubilee Pilgrimage Site in the Archdiocese for the day of February 2, 2025. Therefore, the faithful who devoutly make a pilgrimage to St. Ignatius Church on February 2nd may obtain the Jubilee Indulgence under the usual conditions.

"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints." (CCC 14 71)



Ways to Obtain the Jubilee Indulgence:

- **Pilgrimages:** Pilgrims may obtain the Jubilee Indulgence by visiting specific sacred places, such as the four Major Papal Basilicas in Rome, or other designated pilgrimage sites worldwide, including Cathedral churches and other designated churches, shrines, and grottos within our diocese. Such designated spaces are found in A Pilgrim's Guide to Jubilee Churches and Shrines. Devoutly participating in Holy Mass and celebrating the Sacrament of Penance will help pilgrims receive the Jubilee indulgence.
- **Pious Visits to Sacred Space:** Likewise, the Jubilee Indulgence may be obtained by visiting designated sacred places for Eucharistic adoration, prayer, and meditative reflection. In doing so, one should include praying the Lord's Prayer (Our Father), the Profession of Faith (Apostle's Creed or Nicene Creed), invocations to Mary, the Mother of God, and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
- **Works of Mercy and Penance:** In addition, acts of mercy and works of charity, such as visiting the sick, prisoners, the lonely, feeding the hungry and assisting the poor and others in need, can lead to the Indulgence. In doing so, one should include praying the Lord's Prayer (Our Father), the Profession of Faith (Apostle's Creed or Nicene Creed), invocations to Mary, the Mother of God, and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father with those they visit.
- **Special Considerations:** Those who cannot travel may receive the Jubilee Indulgence by spiritually uniting themselves with the holy year celebrations through prayer and offering up their sufferings. In doing so, one should include praying the Lord's Prayer (Our Father), the Profession of Faith (Apostle's Creed or Nicene Creed), invocations to Mary, the Mother of God, and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.

One should be spiritually prepared to receive the Jubilee Indulgence. Namely, by being in a state of grace, having made a good confession, and attending Mass regularly.
